Exciting News

I am very pleased to share with you some exciting news from the recent state budget. Modbury High School has been identified as one of 139 schools to share in a \$250 million STEM infrastructure project. MHS will receive up to \$2.5 million towards facilities to support the learning in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics. Planning for these facilities will start immediately with construction to be completed before the end of 2018.

Contemporary facilities and learning approaches will help to engage our students and prepare them for future jobs in defence and advanced manufacturing.

TERM 2 PRINCIPAL'S AWARDS

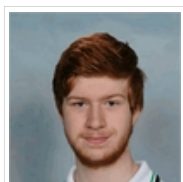
