

Year 11 Mid-Year Exams 2023 – Student Information

Year 11 exams will be held in Week 8 (19th – 23rd June) in the Flexi building open space. Please carefully read through the rules below.

The following procedures and rules apply for all exams:

- Check your exam timetable carefully, you should arrive 20 minutes before the exams begin
- Sign in using the sign-in sheets in F1
- If you are absent a medical certificate is required (a parent or guardian must also phone the school on the morning of the exam) otherwise you will receive a 0 result, this will impact 2024 subject choices
- Students must be in full school uniform to be permitted to sit their exam/s
- Check with your teacher regarding whether you have an electronic exam. You must attend with your laptop fully charged
- Students are to enter through classroom F1 outside door, bags must be left in here, where they will be locked for the duration of the exams
- Any pens/pencils etc. need to be in a **clear** pencil case or zip lock bag
- Graphics calculators need to be reset for all exams except maths, covers must be removed and in bags
- No smart watches or phones are permitted
- Snacks need to be in a small container with no wrappers
- Water needs to be in a see-through bottle
- Please use the bathroom prior to the exam, toilet breaks do not mean you will get any additional time
- If all assignment work is not submitted prior to Week 8, you may be expected to attend the Learning Centre / practical work areas at the discretion of your subject teachers – double lessons for non-examinable subjects will be running
- Dictionaries will be provided in the exam upon student request
- For mathematics exams please make sure you check with your subject teacher regarding the requirements for formula sheets
- Any breach of exam rules will be reported to Year Level Leader and SACE Assistant Principal and may result in penalties
